But this kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting. (Matthew 17:19-21)

To develop a strong faith capable of overcoming challenging circumstances in life, we can learn from the example of Jesus. Through prayer and fasting, we can apply miracle-working faith, capable of casting out troublesome circumstances – sin, emotional trauma, overwhelming debt, substance abuse, sickness, pain, lack of forgiveness, and anger – as Jesus did. By seeking His guidance and relying on His power, we can overcome every obstacle in 2024.

As part of our daily devotional, we will focus on the names of Jesus. I encourage you to study and reflect on each name to draw closer to Jesus this year.

JESUS

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1:21)

TODAY'S FOCUS: The name Jesus is derived from the Hebrew name Joshua, meaning "the LORD is salvation." Joshua demonstrated courageous leadership in the Old Testament by leading the Israelites into Canaan. Jesus, on the other hand, saved humanity through a significant personal battle, paving the way for people to enter God's promised land of divine presence.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Dear Jesus, the name above all names, I am grateful that You came to save not only Israel but all those who seek Your help. I ask for Your forgiveness if I have used Your name in vain or treated it lightly. Jesus, I pray for Your guidance and assistance in living a life that brings honor to Your name. Amen.



DAY TWO

THE RESURRECTION & THE LIFE

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; (John 11:25)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Death is a common fear for those who don't believe in God. The uncertainty of what lies beyond death can be overwhelming. However, Jesus conquered death by willingly sacrificing His own life. He didn't simply put an end to death but instead overcame it. As Scripture reminds us, "Death has been swallowed up in victory." (1 Corinthians 15:54). Through His resurrection, Jesus promises new life to those who put their faith in Him.

DAY THREE

KING OF THE JEWS

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." (Matthew 2:2)

TODAY'S FOCUS: The wise men embarked on a quest to find Jesus when He was born, specifically seeking the one known as the King of the Jews. However, this title, King of the Jews, stirred up hatred and envy in King Herod. It's important to note that no earthly king could ever rival Jesus. Remarkably, Jesus isn't just the King of the Jews but of all humanity. He initially arrived as a humble King but will return as a warrior King to assert His rightful claim. John enlightens us with a vivid description of this profound truth in the book of Revelation: "On His robe and on His thigh He has this name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS" (Rev 19:16).

TODAY'S PRAYER: Lord Jesus, I humbly offer my praise to You as the King, not only of the Jewish people but also of all humanity. I acknowledge that there are times when I fail to honor You as my King. Please extend Your forgiving grace to me. I deeply love You and express my gratitude for including Gentiles in Your plan of Salvation. Instill in me a genuine love for Israel, mirroring the affection You have for them. May we all unite in worshiping You. Amen.

DAY FOUR

IMMANUEL

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel. (Isaiah 7:14)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus' birth and life teach us a profound truth: God desires intimate closeness with His people. When He created humans, He breathed His own life into us, shaping us in His image so we could have a deep connection with Him. The name Immanuel, which means "God with us." Reflecting on this, we are in awe of how God humbled Himself, assuming human form and becoming one of us. It is remarkable that God made a way to be close to us.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Dear Jesus, I am grateful for your presence and the opportunity to draw near to you. Please forgive me for the times I have overlooked this privilege. Your name, Immanuel, signifies that you are close to me. I pray that you would help me understand the heart of God the Father in a more profound way. May I fully grasp the significance of Your name, Immanuel, so I do not take your closeness for granted. Amen.

DAY FIVE

HOLY ONE OF GOD

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Now, there was a man in their synagogue with an unclean spirit. And he cried out, saying, "Let us alone! What have we to do with You, Jesus of Nazareth? Did You come to destroy us? I know who You are—the Holy One of God!" (Mark 1:23-24)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus' name, the Holy One of God, carries immense authority and is feared by demons. This powerful name holds dominion over death, hell, and the evil forces that engage in spiritual warfare. We must learn to tap into this name's protection. We can live victoriously by acknowledging and embracing the full impact of Jesus' name, the Holy One of God.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Dear Jesus, I am grateful for your role as my deliverer. Whenever I feel bound by Satan's influence, I have faith in your ability to set me free through your name, Holy One of God. I humbly ask for your forgiveness for the sins that have bound me. I declare my release, empowered by the blood and name of the Holy One of God. Use me, Jesus, to help others know who You are. Amen.



LAMB OF GOD

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: The next day, John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! (John 1:29)

TODAY'S FOCUS: In the Bible, sacrificial lambs were important in bearing the burden of sins. This act symbolically transferred the guilt from the sinner to the innocent lamb, declaring the person innocent while the animal was punished for sin, which was death. However, the arrival of Jesus Christ, known as the Lamb of God, fulfilled and exceeded the sacrificial system. Through His sacrificial death on the cross, He provided atonement for all of humanity's sins, which can be received through faith in Him. It is crucial to understand that God does not overlook our sins but acknowledges them and offers a solution through His own Son. This profound truth allows us to establish a meaningful relationship with God, all because of the Lamb of God.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Dear Jesus, I express my deep love and gratitude towards you as the Lamb of God who takes away the world's sins. In this moment, I confess my sins to You and receive the precious gift of forgiveness that only You can provide. I humbly ask for guidance on how to honor Your name as the Lamb of God. Show me the path to take that allows me to use my time, talents, and resources in ways that bring glory to Your name. Amen.



DAY SEVEN

LIGHT OF THE WORLD

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life." (John 8:12)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus illuminates our lives with His brilliance. He reveals our sins, reminds us of our need for redemption, and guides us toward everlasting life. As the Light of the World, Jesus awakens our souls to see the beauty surrounding us and God's works. We can be lights in the darkness, sharing the hope that Jesus brings. TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus graciously restored peace wherever He traveled during His time on earth. DAY NINE

BREAD OF LIFE

DAY TEN

MESSIAH

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: "Know therefore and understand, That from the going forth of the command To restore and build Jerusalem Until Messiah the Prince, There shall be seven weeks and sixty-two weeks; The street shall be built again, and the wall, Even in troublesome times. (Daniel 9:25-26)

TODAY'S FOCUS: The Old Testament prophets foretold the coming of Jesus as the Messiah. Israel anticipated His arrival, and in the New Testament, Andrew informed his brother Simon, "We have found the Messiah, which means Christ" (John 1:41). As the Messiah, Jesus brought joy to the world then and continues to do so now. The arrival of the Messiah fulfilled God's promise of redemption for all of humanity.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Jesus, you revealed Yourself as the Messiah to the woman at the well who expressed her anticipation for Your coming. Y THOUGHTS

DAY ELEVEN

Shiloh

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: The scepter shall not depart from Judah, Nor a lawgiver from between his feet, Until Shiloh comes; And to Him shall be the obedience of the people. (Genesis 49:10)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jacob shares a prophetic message with his son Judah where he declares, "The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until Shiloh comes, and to him shall be the obedience of the people." Shiloh, which refers to Jesus, means"He whose right it is" or "Whom it belongs." Through this name, Shiloh, we understand Jesus as ruler over everything.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Jesus, Your name Shiloh holds the meaning of "He whose right it is." It reminds me that everything belongs to You as the Messiah and great King. Lord Jesus, please forgive me for the times when I've tried to move forward without You. Help me always remember that true peace is found in You. Jesus, please set me free from anything that tries to hold me back. Grant me the peace and comfort I need to navigate through each day. I earnestly seek Your perfect peace as You, Shiloh, reign over everything. Amen.

TRUE VINE

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. (John 15:1)

TODAY'S FOCUS: In the book of Isaiah, Israel is the vineyard of the Lord Almighty, with the people of Judah representing the vines. The Lord expected them to follow righteous paths, but sadly, they turned to violent and wicked acts instead. (Isaiah 5:7) In contrast, Jesus, the True Vine, exemplifies faithfulness, fulfilling all the Father asks. Without Him, we are prone to succumb to sinful tendencies. However, by remaining connected to Jesus, the True Vine, we receive the sustenance and nourishment needed to lead fruitful lives.

DAY THIRTEEN

GOOD SHEPHERD

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: "I am the Good Shepherd. The Good Shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. (John 10:11)

TODAY'S FOCUS: In John 10, Jesus said, "I am the Good Shepherd." Through this name, Jesus cares deeply for us. He watches over us, providing guidance and protection. MAN OF SORROWS

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: He is despised and rejected by men, a Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. (Isaiah 53:3)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Isaiah 53 is a prophecy that foretells the Messiah's sufferings. In Isaiah 53:3, Jesus is referred to as a Man of sorrows. It is important to note that while this name implies sadness, Jesus was not perpetually sad. There were moments when Jesus exuded great joy, as seen in Luke 10:21. However, Jesus had an intimate understanding of sorrow and grief. He experienced all of the sorrows in both body and soul and bore the burdens of man's struggle to obey. Despite all the sorrows He felt, Jesus loved the Father deeply, and His sacrificial act opened the door to salvation for all of us.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Jesus, I acknowledge the profound sorrow that surpassed the physical torment You endured during the beatings and crucifixion. I humbly ask for Your forgiveness for not expressing gratitude for the emotional, spiritual, and physical suffering You willingly faced to ensure that I would never be disconnected from God once I placed my faith in You for salvation. Thank You, Jesus, for being a Man of sorrows, and for carrying the weight of the world's sins. I seek Your guidance in leading others to You. Amen.

Y THOUGHTS

LORD OF LORDS

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: For in due season, Christ will be revealed from heaven by the blessed and only Almighty God, the King of kings and Lord of lords. (1 Timothy 6:15)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus holds a unique and unparalleled position as the ultimate Lord. His lordship surpasses any other lords or kings in existence. It is important to acknowledge Jesus' rightful place as Lord and willingly submit to His sovereign rule. While Jesus possesses the power and authority to accomplish His purposes, He does not force His lordship upon us. As the Lord of Lords, Jesus has the strength to overcome all opposition against Him and His followers. We align ourselves with His victorious reign by placing our faith in Him.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Lord Jesus, I acknowledge and honor Your Lordship over everything. You reign supreme, with authority and power that transcends all. DAY SIXTEEN

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Jesus told him, "I am the Way—yes, and the Truth and the Life. No one can get to the Father except by means of me. (John 14:6)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus is the embodiment of God's truth. Every word He utters carries the utmost truth, and His life exemplifies an unwavering commitment to truth. DAY EIGHTEEN

DAYSPRING

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Through the tender mercy of our God, with which the Dayspring from on high has visited us. (Luke 1:78)

TODAY'S FOCUS: The glory of God departed from the Temple, and the voice of the prophets ceased in Israel for an extended period. However, God did not forget His people; the day finally arrived when He spoke through Zacharias. He prophesied about the long-awaited Messiah and the revelation of God's glory in Jesus Christ, the Dayspring from on high. He is the source of life, hope, peace, and love. As believers who have received salvation by grace through faith, we are responsible for reflecting Christ's light to everyone we encounter. DAY NINETEEN

WORD OF GOD

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. (John 1:1)

TODAY'S FOCUS: The opening verse of John's Gospel provides powerful insights into the divine nature of the Word. John declares that even before the world existed, the Word existed and coexisted with God. Further reference to "the beginning" can be found in Genesis 1:1, when God created the heavens and the earth. Through this profound statement in John 1:1, we are introduced to one of the fundamental pillars of our faith, the doctrine of the Trinity – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Dear Jesus, You are the eternal Word. Before all creation, You already existed as the Word. You were with God, and You were God. Jesus, I acknowledge the power that resides in Your Word. Please forgive me for my lack of discipline in studying, meditating on, and unleashing the power of You and Your Word in my life. Help me show greater reverence and honor to Your Word. Instill in me a continuous longing to meditate on Your Word and remain in You as the living Word of God. Amen.

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DAY TWENTY

LORD OF GLORY

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Our words are wise because they are from God, telling of God's wise plan to bring us into the glories of heaven. This plan was hidden in former times, though it was made for our benefit before the world began. But the great men of the world have not understood it; if they had, they never would have crucified the Lord of Glory. (1 Corinthians 2:7-8)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus is recognized as the Lord of Glory, which means the "glorious Lord" or the "Messiah." Unfortunately, some people failed to see His role as the Lord of Glory. According to 1 Corinthians 2:8, if these individuals had truly understood Jesus' character, recognized the wisdom behind His plan, and understood His work, they would not have put Him to death.

TODAY'S PRAYER: Jesus, I humbly exalt You as the Lord of Glory. You reign in absolute glory, showing the highest expression of all glory. I acknowledge that I may unintentionally give glory to other things instead of You. Please forgive me for allowing anything to overshadow Your glory. Thank You for Your gracious gift of glory. Your radiant glory illuminates my path. Your glorious presence shields me from the darkness. Your glory fills my heart with joy. Jesus, guide me in reflecting Your glorious presence to others.

DAY TWENTY ONE

ALPHA AND OMEGA

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty." (Revelation 1:8)

TODAY'S FOCUS: Jesus is the Alpha and the Omega. This name tells us that He existed before all things and will continue to exist beyond all things. In ancient Greek, Alpha represents the first letter of the alphabet, and Omega represents the last. With this in mind, Jesus is the 'A to Z,' the Beginning and the End. 
